
# **NEW** Regulations for Portable On Board Fire Extinguishers for Your Boat, Set by the United States Coast Guard (USCG)—April 20, 2022

1. Is your fire extinguisher the CORRECT CLASSIFICATION & number for the length of your boat? [Note 1] 2. Is your fire extinguisher not more than 12 years old from the date stamped on the bottle? [Note 2] 3. Is your fire extinguisher meet 'Good and Serviceable'? [Note 3]

### [Note 2]:

Make sure a disposable fire extinguisher is not more than 12 years old from date stamped on it. (Must be removed from service on December 31 of the 12th year).

## [Note 3]:

ALL fire extinguishers must be 'Good and Serviceable' working condition:

- If the extinguisher has a pressure gauge reading or indicator, it must be in the operable range or position (in the green).
- The lock pin is firmly in place.
- The discharge nozzle is clean and free of obstruction.
- The extinguisher does not show visible signs of significant corrosion or damage.
